# Our School

Liddiard Road Primary School is located in Traralgon and was established in 1961. The school caters for children from Prep to Year 6, with an enrolment of approximately 270 children. The school is located in close proximity to local pre-schools, post-primary schools, Gippsland Training and Further Education (T.A.F.E.) Colleges and Federation University (Churchill Campus).

Liddiard Road Primary School is committed to educational excellence and preparing its young students for life. A safe, secure and supportive environment is of utmost importance and the school is proud of its comprehensive positive student management program. Children are encouraged to take responsibility for their own learning and behaviour, and are provided with challenging life experiences.

# School Facilities

Liddiard Road Primary School is a modern school with a dedicated staff of teachers providing a well-balanced and varied educational program aimed at meeting the needs of all children. You may feel well assured that, while your child is attending the school, he/she will be given every opportunity and encouragement to progress to the best of his/her ability. Extensive landscaping and ground beautification have been carried out, providing a neat and attractive appearance. Apart from the solid work of reading, writing and mathematics, which are the key-note of our school, the following facilities are available and used to complement and enrich existing programs.

## Learning Technology:

At Liddiard Road Primary School we are always striving to provide the students with the most up to date technology and platforms for their use. The school boasts a computer literate staff who are committed to ongoing professional development in this area.

From 2020 the school entered into a lease agreement that will see the school equipped with modern IT devices for all year 3 - 6 students. This has enabled all existing devices to be used by the Prep - Grade 2 area, giving students greater access to technology.

The school also has a computer lab where students in Foundation to Grade 6 participate in weekly sessions run by our ICT teachers.

Other technologies which staff and students make use of to enhance the learning experience include:

- Interactive whiteboards/panels
- Cameras, video and recording equipment and
- A wide range of educational software to build and develop skills.

## Auslan:

Auslan is provided to deaf, hearing impaired and hearing students. Auslan is embraced by the school community and is the school's LOTE subject. As many teachers and students in the school have participated in Auslan classes, communication occurs freely. The facility is well supported by Australian Hearing Services, the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development's speech pathologists and visiting Teachers of the Deaf.

## The Arts (Music, Drama, Art/Craft, Dance):

The Arts provide children with opportunities to develop their creative talents in a purpose set up Art Space.

- **An Art/Craft Specialist Program** utilises our art room facility. Each year the school provides the children with musical/drama opportunities through lunchtime singing and dancing, unit and school assemblies, class activities and the annual whole school concert.
- **Cultural visits** to the school are an extremely valuable way of exposing children to quality cultural experiences. These performances usually complement work completed in Art & Music related subjects. The cost of these visits is kept to a minimum to encourage all children to attend.



# School Programs

## Physical Education Program:

Our Physical Education Program encompasses the areas of body co-ordination, endurance, ball skills, athletics, as well as major and minor ball games. These facets are designed to build up body strength, mobility, flexibility and fundamental skills. It is therefore essential that children be suitably dressed to enable maximum participation and benefit. The school provides opportunities for sporting excellence with representative teams competing in many sporting areas.

## School Camp Program:

The school has developed an excellent program for children in years 3 to 6. We endeavour to provide opportunities and the experiences for children to develop a variety of personal, social and physical skills in an environment differing from the home and school surrounds. Our program fosters the development of the child's appreciation of out-door experiences, awareness of the natural environment, experience in the range of skills required to cope with this environment, and establishes a foundation for future recreation attitudes and activities.



## Swimming & Water Safety Program:

Children have the opportunity to take part in our swimming program. Students are introduced to a water familiarisation and confidence program at appropriate local indoor venues. Qualified Austswim trained teachers ensure a well-balanced swimming and water safety program. The program operates in a two-week intensive block.

## Breakfast Club:

The school runs a Breakfast Club from Tuesday to Friday mornings (8.15am-8.45am). All children are welcome to attend.



## Scholastic Book Club:

Book Club gives children the opportunity to purchase books of high interest at reduced prices. Notices are sent home twice each term. **The buying of these books is strictly optional.** It is an easy way of building up a stock of books that parents may read to their child or that children may read themselves. Children and parents can also purchase books from our Book Fair which takes place in the library.

## Transition:

The school is proud of both its Preschool to Foundation and Year 6 to Secondary Transition Programs.

Regular visits between our school and local preschools are held with strong relationships being formed. School experience sessions are offered to all local preschools and day-care centres. Following this, an extensive transition program is run prior to grade placements, allowing staff to build a strong rapport with students and to gather information on personal learning styles. This information, together with the Transition Statement is used in forming grades. Students become familiar with their learning environment and become excited about starting school.

A Grade 6 to Year 7 transition program has been established with Traralgon College and many activities are scheduled to assist in the transition process.

Additional visits are planned for integration and other students identified as 'at risk' in learning, to build confidence and to familiarise students with their new surroundings.

## Environmentalists

Our environmental leaders comprise of students from years 5 and 6. They are students who are interested in improving our school environment through different actions and initiatives.

The environmental leaders meet on a regular basis to monitor and undertake environmental initiatives around the school. These include:

- Thinking of ways to improve school environmental actions.
- Looking after the animals at play times and doing gardening activities around our school grounds.
- Meeting visitors who come to the school to see our school garden.
- Visiting other schools to take part in environmental activities.

Our school has a vegetable garden that promotes healthy eating attitudes, exposure to new tastes and a sense of community. The planting, care, harvesting and cooking are overseen by enthusiastic staff members and student environment leaders.



Students also have other opportunities to fulfill leadership roles by participating in the Junior School Council (grades 3-6), The Reading Tutors Program and by being House Captains of our four houses: Avon, Latrobe, Macalister and Thompson.

# Wellbeing

The wellbeing of our students and their academic success are our highest priorities. We pride ourselves on the strength of relationships developed between, students and between students and teachers. Liddiard Road Primary has a strong, well-staffed Student Well Being Team

## **Nurture Room**

The Student Support Team assists students in a variety of ways, including day to day assistance with school, and out of school life, where needed.

## **School Nurse**

Our School Nurse is a part of the Wellbeing Team and is on site 3 days a week. She is able to assist students and their families with all health issues.



## **Koorie Engagement Support Officer (KESO)**

Our School KESO is an important support for Aboriginal students in our school. The role of the KESOs is to engage and support Aboriginal students, their families, teachers and school staff.

## **Grade 5 and 6 Electives**

The Elective Program runs on a fortnightly basis where students participate in a student created list of activities. Students have a choice on which group they would like to attend. Activities in the past have included, arts and craft, sports and games, knitting and Lego.

# Student Enrolment

## Family Details

Personal details listed on the family enrolment form have proved extremely important in ensuring that your child is quickly taken care of in the case of illness or an accident.

In situations requiring further care or treatment, the parent and other parent nominated emergency contact person will be contacted immediately.

If the illness or injury is serious and the parents or a contact person cannot be located, the child will be conveyed to either a local clinic or casualty section of the Latrobe Regional Hospital.

Parents are encouraged to be ambulance subscribers. In the event of an emergency, along with the principal (or delegate) permission, an ambulance will be called. The cost of ambulance transport will be the parents' responsibility.

It is most important that **family details be kept up to date**. In the event of a change of address, work or home telephone number/s could you please notify the school so that alterations can be recorded. Please contact the administration staff at the Main Office to update records as necessary.

## Permission Forms

Parent/Guardian consent is required before your child/children can go on excursions/camps.

Under no circumstances will children be allowed to go on excursions without having the appropriate permission form completed by a parent/guardian via XUNO or a signed paper copy.

**Only children who display consistently acceptable behaviour will be allowed to participate in special school events and excursions.**

## Camp, Sport and Excursion Funds (CSEF)

*The Camp, Sport and Excursion Funds (CSEF) is provided by the Government to help meet the educational needs of your children. To be eligible for CSEF, families must have current Health Care Card. Full details are available from the office.*

## Voluntary Curriculum Contribution

Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students. We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising or volunteering your time. This has made a huge difference to our school and the programs we can offer.

The **voluntary** contribution fee is \$100.00 per child.

## Communication

Our parent/teacher communication system is called XUNO. XUNO Family is an app that will help make communication with the school quick and easy. Parents/Guardians will be sent a welcome email when their child enrolls which will allow you to see all the school's newsletters, announcements and events for parent approval. It also provides a personal messaging system between the teachers and parent/guardians between 8am – 5pm. It is especially useful for informing the school about attendance.

# Parent Involvement

## School Council

The School Council is empowered by the Victorian Department of Education & Early Childhood Development to determine the general policy of the school within Ministerial guidelines, and to facilitate the day-to-day running of the school. School Council members meet to represent the school community on the 1st Monday of each month.

School Council consists of 9 members:

- Principal
- 3 Department of Education representative
- 4 parent representatives
- 2 community member

The term of office for elected members is two years. Parent and Community representatives serve on the Council for a two-year period. The school community is notified via the weekly newsletter in March each year, regarding changes in membership.

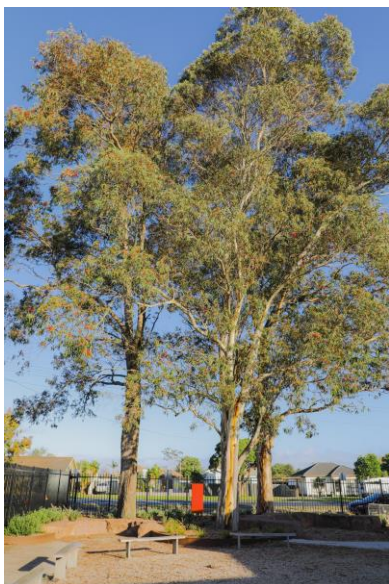
Please make use of your representatives and help keep everyone well informed. We want to know about your views, concerns and ideas.

# School Uniform



Our school uniform consists of:

- Maroon broad-brimmed or bucket hat
- Maroon school bag (Optional)

Appropriate footwear is most important for children to participate actively both in the playground and in our Physical Education Program. School shoes or sneakers are recommended. If rubber gumboots are worn during winter, please ensure a change of footwear (slippers) is provided for classroom use. Thongs are not allowed for safety reasons.

## Sunsmart Policy

Our school implements a **Sunsmart Policy** which requires that hats be worn outside at all times during first and fourth terms. Children not wearing hats will be restricted to a designated shaded location during recesses.

## Replacement Clothing

At times children require a change of clothing at school. As we often find it difficult to maintain adequate supply of replacement clothing, any donations of clean used garments would be greatly appreciated. Sizes to fit years Prep – 3, as well as tracksuit pants for older children are the most in demand. If your child uses emergency clothing, please wash and return it to school as soon as possible.

## Naming Belongings

We ask that your child's **name be clearly marked** on all articles that are brought to school, especially coats, wind-cheaters and jumpers. All clothing that has been unclaimed will be placed in a central position for children and parents to sort through. The lost property area is located outside the Nurture Room. Unclaimed items unable to be used by the school, will be donated to charitable organisations at the end of each term.
